	Music Development Plan
1 – Overall objective	To inspire creativity and self-expression, laying the foundations for a life-long love of music.
2 – Key components	 Music curriculum through use of Charanga music scheme, Reception-Year 2. Classroom instrumental/vocal teaching as provided by Trafford Music Service. Clear progression from EYFS classroom music curriculum teaching to the end of KS1. Clear progression of instrumental teaching through the consistent use of Trafford Music Service from Reception to Year 2. Termly year group parent assemblies including music focus. Christmas parent assemblies/singalongs for Nursery and Year 1. Christmas productions for Reception and Year 2, performing for parents. Extra-curricular Singing Club for KS1 children run by Trafford Music Service. Strong musical links with Moorlands Junior School including Moorlands Orchestra/choir/recorder group visits. Musical parents/parents that work in the Music industry invited into school to share their skills and knowledge. Trafford Music Service in-school ukulele/piano tuition on a 1:1/small group basis, beginning in September 2024. Oracy scheme of work including opportunities for 'Spotlight' presentations, from Nursery to Year 2.



	 Reception and KS1 joint singing assemblies Local secondary schools to share their music expertise e.g. performance of choir. Use of tailored listening scheme, to coordinate music listened to when coming in and out of assemblies. Staff who are musical/have a love of music to have the opportunity to share their knowledge and skills. Music Mark Certificate 2024 pending.
3 – Classroom instrumental teaching	Through funding provided by the Friends of Templemoor, children from Reception to Year 2 have the opportunity to take part in an instrumental/vocal learning project, run by Trafford Music Service.
4 – Implementation of key components	 Clear progression of knowledge and skills from Nursery to Year 2 (see attached document) Use of Charanga Music Scheme from Reception to Year 2. Use of Oracy Policy progression map to ensure progression of oracy skills from Nursery-Year 2 (see attached document) as included in assemblies and performances. Trafford Music Service staff run the Singing Club and all instrumental/vocal projects. Listening scheme and progression of singing skills using advice given by Trafford Music Service. Approach local secondary schools to encourage musical links.
5 – Communication activities	Music offer displayed on Music tab of school website. Parents made aware of Musical opportunities both in curriculum time and as an extra-curricular club.

6 – Evaluation process for the success of the Music Development Plan 7 – Transition work with local secondary schools *(N/A)	 TMS Singing Club reviewed after each term. New teacher in post as of Sept 2024. TMS 1:1/small group ukulele/piano tuition to be reviewed termly by AL/SLT/TMS. First phase of teaching begins in Sept 2024. Singing assemblies to continue in Sept 2024, this time to include Reception, as agreed by SLT. Continually reviewed by AL, reviewed by SLT termly. Use of listening scheme/music in assemblies to continue. Reviewed by AL and SLT at Christmas 2024. Oracy scheme linked and checked alongside assembly/performance requirements. Strong musical links with Moorlands Junior School including Moorlands Orchestra/choir/recorder group visits. Moorlands musical opportunities to be advertised at the second of the sec
*Junior school	 Moorlands musical opportunities to be advertised at the end of the academic year to children leaving school to go to Year 3. Parents to be given information about how/when chdn will have these opportunities offered. Year 2 music projects with TMS chosen with consideration as to what would lead on best to music provision in Year 3 at Moorlands. 1:1/small group ukulele/piano tuition available as of Sept 2024, which feeds into Moorlands Music provision of guitar/piano at Year 3.
8 – Budget materials and staffing	 Friends of Templemoor generously fund Trafford Music Service provision from Reception to Year 2. Extra-Curricular music sessions (Singing Club and ukulele/piano tuition) are funded by parents, operated directly by Trafford Music Service. School pupil premium funding available for extracurricular sessions. Free Charanga Music Scheme training available for staff.
9 – Pupil Premium and SEND provision	 Keep a record of Pupil Premium children engaged in extra-curricular music activities. Review Pupil Premium budget and ensure quality provision for children who cannot access paid-for provision. Regularly review access arrangements for SEN children within curriculum music lessons and beyond. Review music curriculum with SENDCO to consider any adjustments needed for children with additional needs.



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10 – Summary Action Plan	 Request to Friends of Templemoor for the funding of Trafford Music Service sessions for Reception to Year 2 has been approved as of July 2024. Request to Trafford Music Service for session choices has been sent in and awaiting approval. Request to Trafford Music Service to arrange 1:1/small group ukulele and piano tuition has been agreed. Singing Club advertisement assembly is scheduled for early Sept 2024, the club will restart soon afterwards. Singing will begin during the Wednesday assemblies in early September. Use of Listening scheme will be continued for use in assemblies and classrooms. Templemoor's Oracy Scheme will be reviewed and progressive Spotlight opportunities will take place from Nursery to Year 2. Further musical opportunities to engage with and learn from Moorlands Junior School and local secondary schools will be planned and actioned. Ensure that Pupil Premium children have fully funded access to extra-curricular music.
	 Work closely with the SENDCO to ensure that all

children including those with additional needs, are

able to access the music curriculum.
